He has a family farm in the Wairarapa and is also on the hunt for his next adventure!






Hamish Midgley, Head Business Development, Rabobank

After a science background (biochemistry), Catharine was called to the Bar by Lincoln's Inn then worked for the Department for the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs in the UK before making NZ her home, where she has worked in regulatory roles.

Dr Ping Liu - Associate Professor, University of Otago

These programmes work together to protect and enhance the reputation of New Zealand's primary industries.


